Franz Liszt composed his Piano Concerto No. 1 in E^b major, S over a year period; the main themes date from , while the final version is dated The concerto consists of four movements and lasts approximately 20 minutes The orchestra introduces the main theme of the piece with a powerful motif.

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It begins with high drama, retreats to a place of calm and rushes toward its close in a mood of white-hot energy. The epic mood links the work explicitly to the tradition of the Beethoven symphony that Brahms sought to emulate. Solo clarinet has the second subject, and these two theme-groups develop at some length.

Hence, the edition is public domain in its country of origin or a government publication. The Rubinstein brothers—composer Nikolai and pianist Anton—invited him to join the faculty of the Moscow Conservatory, and Tchaikovsky moved to Moscow in January to become a professor of harmony.
